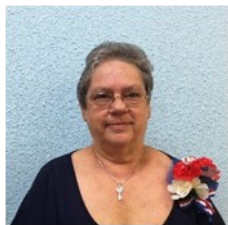

We are asking for donations of cheese, crackers, nuts, etc. to provide snacks for the night. If you can help with this, please let me know.

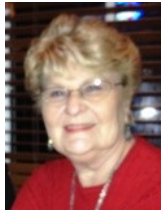
To all units that have made donations so far, I say, thank you. You are showing that the units in each district can work together and that is what this is all about.

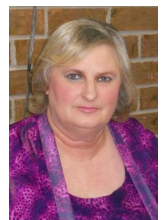
Auxiliary. I hope that everyone is having an outstanding year with their Unit's activities. Keep promoting our mission and projects of the Auxiliary through Public Relations!

- Call to Convention (*snail mail to Unit Presidents only*)
- Proposed Amended Department By-Laws and Standing Rules
- Letter of explanation regarding voting on the Amendment
- Unit Delegate form (*snail mail to Unit Presidents only*)
- Proposed Convention Program

We will be voting on the amended Department By-Laws and Standing Rules at State Convention. That's why we are sending them out 30 days prior to Convention. Our C&B Committee has worked very hard revising our Bylaws to be in standing with National's Bylaws. Please read them. You might learn something new in the process.

The Unit Delegate form is provided for you to list your delegates AND PAY YOUR DELEGATE FEES PRIOR TO CONVENTION. The delegates your unit can vote are listed at the top. Remember, *the rule is that unless you are pre-registered, you cannot vote if a ballot vote is called for. This form is due to the Department Headquarters 15 days prior to State Convention. This gives us time to put the delegate numbers in sealed envelopes for units eligible to vote. Have mercy on me and mail them on time please!*

By the time you receive your newsletter, the office will be closed for Girls State. We will be at Mississippi State University this year. In case of emergency, you know my cell number. Girls State is June 6-12. DON'T CALL THE OFFICE! I WON'T BE THERE!

We are going to have a great time at Convention this year. President Mary plans a very productive and entertaining session. Hope to see you there!
